In an era where misinformation spreads rapidly and complex public health issues require widespread understanding, **the ability to communicate science through compelling stories has never been more crucial**. This interactive workshop, led by Dr. Elisabeth (Liz) Marnik, PhD, will equip participants with practical tools to translate their work into narratives that resonate with diverse audiences.

Dr. Marnik, Director of Science Education and Outreach at the **MDI Biological Laboratory**, Chief Scientific Officer for **Those Nerdy Girls**, and founder of **Science Whiz Liz**, is a scientist, a science communicator, an educator, and a member of the inaugural **Burness Public Health Creator Fellows**. Drawing on her expertise in genetics and immunology, and public engagement, Dr. Marnik will guide participants through the fundamentals of narrative structure, strategies for communicating accuracy with accessibility, and techniques for connecting scientific content to human experience. Participants will practice crafting stories that build trust, foster understanding, and inspire action in classrooms, communities, and policy conversations.

WHAT YOU'LL LEARN

Through discussion, hands-on exercises, and peer feedback, attendees will leave with a **draft narrative** tailored to their own work and a **toolkit** for continuing to strengthen their public health storytelling.
